Invitation to communion

All are welcome to come to God's table to be blessed. God's grace is freely given to all.

Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin and seek to live in peace with one another. Therefore, let us confess our sin before God and one another.

Confession

Gracious God, you have given us the world. Yet too often we have taken it for granted, and failed to respect your great gift. We have not always remembered that you have entrusted your cherished creation to us. Remind us, O God, that we are part of creation, not separate from it; that we are part of your people, not separate from them. Forgive us when we take your gifts and your people for granted, and help us start again. In your blessed name, we pray. Amen.

Words of Assurance

God is with us to the end of the age, God's presence will be made full again. And so will our hearts. Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God and place your faith in Christ.

All: Thanks be to God. Amen.

The Lord be with you.
And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, who has given us the gift of eternal life in Christ. We give you thanks for brothers and sisters who travel together in the ways of peace.

Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ, who sent the Holy Spirit to be with us, so that we would not be left alone.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory are yours, almighty God, now and forever.
